Welcome to Summer School 2019!

We are excited to offer a variety of fun, engaging, learning opportunities that will fit into your summer schedule. Our Summer School Program will run 4 weeks this year. The first day will be June 10th and our last day will be July 11th, but, you have the flexibility of attending classes when you can.

***Please note: Classes for Grades K-8 are Monday through Thursday only.
High School Classes have specific meeting times and dates that may differ.***

Please note: There are no classes the week of July 1st.

You can decide when to attend sessions. We hope you join us all 4 weeks, but you can attend as many weeks as you would like to and are able to with your summer schedule! If you sign up for a session, please do your best to attend that session. Chequamegon students may attend sessions at either campus. Please remember, transportation is not provided for summer school.

You can sign up for as many sessions of summer school as you would like. With the various offerings and flexible scheduling, we hope we can meet your summer learning needs. Supervision will be provided from 7:30 a.m. - 8:00 a.m. Students should not be dropped off any earlier than 7:30 a.m. Free breakfast and lunch will be provided during the 8:00 a.m.-12 p.m. sessions June 10-13, June 17-20, June 24-27 and July 8-11. Breakfast will run from 7:30 a.m. - 7:55 a.m. Lunch will be provided from 12:00 p.m.-12:30 p.m. The office will open at that time!

Great Desert Island STEAM Challenge (Glidden Campus)

Miss Breanna Hanson Grades 6-8

Combine science, technology, engineering, and math in planning and creating awesome projects to complete the Great Desert Island STEM Challenge! Each challenge will help you make it back to civilization: construct a hut, build a bridge, make a waterproof container, build a coconut catapult, and construct a raft! Create many more projects along the way like a smore solar oven!

Let's Knit a Thing or Two! (Glidden Campus)

Mrs. Stoiber Grades 6-8, 9-12

This is an exciting course for learning to knit! Those who already know how to knit are also welcome. You will learn to knit and then make an incredible project of your choice. We will be going through all basic stitches of knitting, purling, casting off and on. I will be your personal teacher and guide through this amazing process. Walk away with a special project you can call your very own. Time spent in this class will be a bonding experience for the whole class. As we cheer each other on. Hope to see you there! Needles and yarn will be provided.

One Room Schoolhouse (Glidden Campus)

Mrs. Michelle Hanson Grades 2-5

Class will soon be in session at the Glidden One Room Schoolhouse, and this summer we will explore "Old Time Fun & Games." We'll learn about how people lived 100 years ago, and we'll find out how children played and entertained themselves in days gone by. We'll also get to see what school was like 100 years ago. We'll do reading (Daily Five Stations), writing (journal), and hands on math, as well as recess! We'll write on slates, learn fun games, and make some creative crafts. In addition, we will spend an hour each day in our Makerspace room. We will finish our day with technology using Sphero, Ozobots, and Little Bits, Bee-Bots, iPads, and Chromebooks. Sphero is a spherical robot which will inspire a love of robotics, coding, and STEM principles. Ozobots allow students to draw mazes, paths, intersections, and create entire worlds and explore coding capabilities. Little Bits is a platform of easy-to-use electronic building blocks that empower children to invent anything. Come spend the whole day with us in a multi-aged, hands-on-learning all day experience.

Playgroup (Glidden Campus)

Plant....astic the Art of Garden Making

Mrs. Brad, Grades K-5, (Park Falls Campus)

Students will have the opportunity to be creative, imaginative, and inventive. This will give students an opportunity to socialize with their friends, learn about flowers, and learn how to design and create a flower garden.

Antler Repair

Mr. Kleist, Grades 6-8, (Park Falls)

Students will learn the basics to fixing broken deer antlers. Students will have the opportunity to learn how to reattach a tine that has been broken off, replace a tine that is missing completely, repair a broken main beam, and repair chew marks from rodents that are so common on shed antlers. Students will also be introduced to very basic techniques of creating an antler replica.

History Through Your Eyes: .5 credit (description continued on next page)

10 AM - 2 PM, Monday-Thursday

June 24 - 27, July 8 - 11, July 29 - Aug 1

Are we doomed to repeat history? Using books, movies and other sources we are going to look at issues that continue to come up in history like conflict, movement of people and revolutions. What have we learned as a society? What if we didn't learn those lessons -- what would life look like? Students will be asked to read three books (a list will be provided), watch movies, listen to podcasts or other sources and be prepared to discuss with the class. You will show us what you know by recreating historical experiences through digital means. This is a class for students entering grades 9-12 and offered for a ½ social studies elective credit; graded on a pass/fail basis.

Class ACT Charter School: .5 credit + Letter Grade, Namekagon River Academy (9-12)

Separate Application Required

Mr. Augustine (Park Falls Campus)

July 8-11, 4 days, 3 nights

This academy explores life hidden below the surface of Lake Namekagon and the Namekagon River. Beginning at Forest Lodge, participants develop paddling skills and study lake ecology, watershed concepts, and the impacts of habitat development on Lake Namekagon. Then, they spend three days traveling downstream on the Namekagon River by canoe. Along their journey, they learn about river ecology, aquatic invasive species, and the human history of the river. They also have an opportunity to experiment with fly-fishing and to meet with representatives from the National Park Service. No experience necessary. This class is being offered to students entering grades 9-12.

Class ACT Charter School: .5 credit + Letter Grade, Forest Lodge Natural Resources Academy

Separate Application Required

Mrs. Zwicke (Park Falls Campus)

June 30-July 3, 4 days, 3 nights

This academy offers an exploration of natural resources. Participants study tree identification and forestry skills, traverse Lake Namekagon by pontoon in search of loon chicks, learn wolf ecology and experience howling in the vast dark north woods, and practice calling in the barred owl at Forest Lodge. Participants work with Northland's Mary Griggs Burke Center for Freshwater Innovation to study current water quality research and laboratory practices. They also learn scientific drawing and watercolor techniques from a professional artist and develop a personal illustrated journal to practice basic writing and to capture their experience. This class is being offered to students entering grades 9-12.

Kayaking Extravaganza: .25 credit/session

Ms. Schemberger/Mr. Kilmore, (Park Falls Campus)

Explore the scenic rivers of northern Wisconsin from lazy meandering rivers to wet and wild rapids. Expand your knowledge of the area and experience wildlife up close and personal. Learn to read the river, map out specific section of waterways, and tinker with GPS navigation. Make the river your personal playground.

Creative Writing: .5 credit

Mrs. Corbett, (Park Falls Campus)

Do you enjoy writing? Then this class is for you! We will be exploring the genres of fiction, poetry, and creative non-fiction.
